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#### TRUSTEES' REPORT

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2014

The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 August 2014.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's governing documents, the Companies Act 2006 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005.

## Structure, governance and management

The charity is a company limited by guarantee.

The management committee, who are also the directors for the purpose of company law, and who served during the period were:

Management committee members are elected or appointed on an annual basis, with officers being elected from the membership of the management committee.

None of the management committee members have any beneficial interest in the company. All of the members of the company have guaranteed to contribute £10 in the event of a winding up.

The management committee have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

## Objectives and activities

The charity is established to support trainee healthcare workers throughout their education so that they can perform to the best of their ability, to add to the absolute numbers of health workers in training, to target those who are under represented in the health profession, to increase the number of health workers working in under served areas, to raise awareness of the different conditions facing health professionals worldwide and to have an appreciation of the global health community.

The charity was established by a Trust Deed dated 26 November 2012 and is registered with the Charity Commission under the number 1149904. It was incorporated on 13 August 2012.

## Achievements and performance

It is the policy of the charity that all funds are used for furtherance of its objectives.

The attached financial statements show the current state of finances which the trustees consider to be sound.

## FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2014

#### Review of charitable activities

This has been another successful year for Health Workers For All and our Medic to Medic programme. We have increased our levels of support to 40 students in medicine, physiotherapy and pharmacy and 7 recent graduates during the reporting period. We have also managed to consolidate the administrative side of the charity without this impacting on that support.

None of this would be possible without the generosity of our sponsors. Their loyalty and continued support is immensely important to our students, who take great comfort from knowing that people care about their situation, as much as the direct support the programme provides. In addition to the founding support we received from the Sir Halley Stewart Trust, we must specifically thank the Tingewick Trust, the Stone Family Foundation, the Bay Tree Charitable Trust, the Evan Cornish Foundation and Peter McCully for their generous support during the year.

There are new challenges on the horizon and we are seeking ways to raise the profile of the charity so we can meet these. Following a year of consolidation, we are now looking to expand again but in a structured and sustainable way. We will be actively campaigning for new and renewed grant funding to build on our solid foundations.

## Reserves policy and contingency position

The Health Workers For All charity was established in 2012 but its activities were initiated in 2007 as the Medic to Medic Programme, under the umbrella of the International Medical Education Trust 2000 charity (no. 3931085). Although our charity is relatively new, our programme of work and our operational practices are well established.

We kept our overheads down by outsourcing our administrative and fundraising activities and augmenting this with support from our network of contacts. This means our charity is less exposed to financial risk and allows us to deploy our funding more effectively.

We have a policy to build up a reserve fund which would be sufficient to see the current cohort of students through to graduation. This target is in our business plan together with the aim to establish our own administrative office on a professional basis, which we have achieved since the beginning of the reporting period. We have factored contingency costs for this into our financial planning to reduce our risk of exposure, as we do for all developments in the charity's activities.

#### STATEMENT OF RESPONSIBILITIES
