Face coverings were made by a volunteer and sold on for charitable donations to raise fundraising income. This volunteer did not receive any renumeration for time or expenses. Local businesses in Rotorua donated gift vouchers to contribute towards the Rotorua raffle. Tickets were sold to increase fundraising income. A group of volunteers also took part in the Buds Bike to Bike personal challenge, receiving sponsorship from friends and family which was donated to Medic to Medic.
